From the Interim Minister

The Search Committee had a good meeting on September 22nd and is ready to get to work. We've decided to begin by having small group meetings starting on October 13th after worship. We'd like those who go away during the winter months to participate in the first meetings. Below are the 3 items to be discussed:

I look forward to hearing how these discussions went when I return at the end of October and look forward to joining you in these continued discussions that will help our churches produce a honest and meaningful local church profile for our search and call process.
